## Role description:

A Clinical Nurse Co-ordinator's purpose is to provide leadership, clinical support and co-ordination to the clinical team in the hospital. They will co-ordinate the teams and work load in the preparation area and wards ensuring that the hospital works as efficiently as possible whilst maximising patient care and welfare. They are responsible for the rota management of the nursing and auxiliary teams, ensuring that the teams are staffed appropriately at all times. They also provide coaching and guidance for nurses and auxiliaries and conduct staff appraisals for the nursing team at regular intervals during the year to help develop and progress the team.

Together we will demonstrate safe, clinical decision-making and expert care together with compassionate communication for patients referred to Fitzpatrick Referrals. You will be care driven, have excellent communication skills, exceptionally organised, thorough and be able to operate in a 24/7 team environment.

## Responsibilities and tasks:

- Provide, promote and develop the highest possible level of nursing care to all patients under our care
- Maintain precise patient records through accurate notes
- Comply with the nursing rota
- Be polite and courteous to all clients at all times and provide help and assistance where needed
- Be courteous and respectful to all members of the team
- Support marketing initiatives and promote our services both within and outside the practice
- Actively participate in and maintain continued professional development
- Assist the Veterinary Specialists with clinical workload by ensuring that the clinical facilities work to their optimum levels
- Co-ordinate the delivery of effective, efficient and excellent patient care
- Direct the admission, discharge and general flow of patients within the clinical area
- Assign nurses and support staff to patients, delegating work and supervising colleagues accordingly
- Ensure the provision of adequate staffing at all times by effective rota management taking into account leave management and variations in demand
- Prioritise and adapt daily plans to cater for emergency admissions
- Provide guidance to the senior nursing team on administering care to patients
- Provide support and answer questions regarding standard operating procedures
- Have continuous responsibility for a defined clinical area on a given shift; including health and safety and inspections
- Work with senior management in documenting the performance of nurses, performing evaluations and promoting best practice by example
- Undertake project work as required by business needs
- Carry out administrative duties as directed by senior management including maintaining adequate supplies and informing staff of changes to protocol
- Represent and promote the practice, its aims and values at all times
- In addition to your main duties you will be required to carry out such other duties consistent with your position to meet the needs of the Company and as the Company may from time to time require
